Carl Newman served as Superintendent of the North Allegheny School District from 1966-1981 and was a dedicated proponent of education throughout his life.

The family of Carl Newman wanted to establish a living memorial, by providing financial assistance to a graduating North Allegheny senior who has a commitment to pursuing a career as a public school teacher and who also has a desire to be a teacher leader in extra curricular activities (i.e. coaching, directing bands, performing arts activities, newspaper sponsor etc) in the school where they teach. The North Allegheny Foundation is pleased to administer and will continue to fund this scholarship opportunity. The family also wishes to have communication with the awardees so they can follow the course of the individual's college and career experience as a living memorial to Dr. Newman.

The Newman Family and the North Allegheny Foundation are offering three \$1,000 scholarships to students who demonstrate the following characteristics:

- 1. A desire to become a public school teacher*
- 2. A Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.8 or higher.*
- 3. A desire to be a leader in an extra curricular activity in the district where employed as a teacher (i.e. coach, band director, play director, sponsor of newspaper or student government)*
- 4. An interest in pursuing a four-year college or university education.*
